EASTERN REGION, GHANA

The Afram Plains crusade was held in a town called Donkorkrom (pronounced *Don-cor-chrome*) in the central-eastern part of Ghana.



This area of Ghana is cut off by water bodies making it very difficult to access. Our trucks crossed the largest man-made lake on Earth (the Volta Lake) and traveled over the bad terrain for several days to get there!



Our team arrived one week before the programme to clear a piece of land with bulldozers and to set up for the massive event. Anticipation filled the air as the day drew closer and there was explosive jubilation as soon as word got around that the evangelist had arrived.

Dag Heward-Mills was warmly welcomed by the chiefs ruling over the 256 settlements that make up the Afram Plains.



Those who came for the crusade arrived by canoes and boats while some walked for several miles, carrying their belongings so they would camp at the site for five days.



This was our largest crusade to date with over 62,400 souls won for Christ and the Lord confirmed His word with signs and wonders.



One of the most touching scenes was during the offertory. Many had no money to bring so they offered their oranges, yams and pineapples to the Lord!



Hundreds attended the free medical outreach. Our Volunteer Doctors, pharmacists and medical students worked tirelessly throughout the day.



It was a five-day crusade and the power of God was truly evident. It was definitely worth the challenge, as we witnessed a plundering of hell and breathtaking miracles!
